2024 New England Mountains & Coast Summarized Itinerary

Trip Begins: Wakefield, Massachusetts (flights into Boston, MA) **Trip Ends:** Wakefield, Massachusetts (flights out of Portland, ME)

Days 1-2: Our group will meet outside of Boston this afternoon. From there, we will climb into our van and

travel to the White Mountains of New Hampshire, where we will spend our first afternoon familiarizing ourselves with our camping gear, getting to know one another, playing games, and getting excited about our trip. We'll hit the trail running (figuratively, of course) on Day 2 as we

set off to explore all that the White Mountains have to offer.

Day 3: On the morning of Day 3, we will meet our rock climbing guides and spend the day climbing the

granite rock faces in New Hampshire's Echo Lake State Park. Our group will practice

communication and teamwork through both belaying and climbing, and there will be a variety of routes available, so there will be something for both our experienced climbers and our first-timers. After conquering the rock together, we'll be more connected as a group and ready for

more adventure ahead.

Days 4-6: For the next several days, we'll day-hike and explore the spectacular Presidential Range of New

Hampshire's White Mountains. From our basecamps in Pinkham Notch and Crawford Notch in the heart of the White Mountains National Forest, we will set out and spend our days picnicking above the tree line in alpine fields and looking for wildlife in the New England woods. We might even try to "bag" some of the peaks in the Presidential Range (including Mount Washington!), a

true highpoint of the trip.

Day 7: On Day 7, we'll leave the pine-scented forest and riverbanks of northern New Hampshire for

Maine's rocky shoreline. We'll spend the afternoon doing volunteer service work with one of

several local community groups.

Day 8: On our last full day together, we will meet our professional sea kayaking guides for a paddling

safety and skills orientation before setting out on the protected waters of Casco Bay near beautiful Orr's Island. There may be time to get in one last swim before we head to Portland's

Old Port for a celebratory dinner at a local restaurant – a great ending to a great trip!

Day 9: Day 9 marks our final morning together. After packing up camp one last time, we'll head back

towards Wakefield to say our final farewells, promising to stay in touch with new friends.

Please note that we often run New England Mountains & Coast with two groups in the field concurrently, an "A" and "B" group. Both groups will include very similar activities but might be in a different order. Students will be placed into groups and will receive their night-by-night itinerary a few weeks before the trip begins. All itineraries are subject to change.
